



DRESS CODE

A high standard of dress encourages respect for individuals in the school community. The GSOTA dress code guidelines are in force on all regular school days.

Polo and Dri-Fit Tshirt options

- Multiple colors available!
- Any grade may wear any color in either shirt.

Uniform Bottoms – May be purchased anywhere, not required to purchase at Harris

- Boys – Shorts or pants in solid khaki, navy, black. **No blue jeans, joggers, sweatpants or athletic slicks.**
- Girls – Shorts, skorts or pants in solid khaki, navy, black. Shorts or skorts length near the knee. **No blue jeans, sheer leggings, joggers, sweatpants or athletic slicks.**

Socks/Shoes/Accessories

Closed-toed, closed-heel shoes worn with socks. No crocs, sandals, skate shoes, boots. Hats may only be worn on dress down days.

Sweaters/Hoodies

- GSOTA logo hoodie from Harris School Uniforms **or** a solid, neutral color hoodie/sweater without logos or patterns.
- NO other jackets, hoodies, sweatshirts, pullovers or other outerwear may be worn.
- Uniform shirt must be worn under outerwear.

Dress Down Days

Clothing on dress down days must conform to standards of propriety reflected in the school uniform. No offensive images or text, immodest cuts or fits, spaghetti straps or other attire deemed inappropriate by administration. No open shoes; closed shoes must be worn at all times.

Uniform Violations

School administrators will determine if clothing is appropriate for school and complies with the dress code. If a student comes to school out of dress code (or dressed inappropriately on dress down days), the parent will be called to immediately bring the student a change of clothing. Habitual or excessive violations of the dress code will result in additional consequences.

Exemptions

Exceptions to the Dress Code shall be permitted when:

- A student's parent requests a reasonable accommodation to address a student's disability or medical condition. Such request shall be provided in writing to the Principal.
- The wearing of clothing in compliance with the Dress Code violates a student's sincerely held religious belief. The student's parent shall submit a signed affidavit setting forth the religious issues and the requested exemption to the policy.
- A parent/guardian notifies the Principal in writing that the student's failure to wear clothing that complies with the Dress Code is due to financial hardship; the school shall offer assistance.
